Veteran Honored

Our presenter at the April meeting will be our own KAHS member, Don Sladek, who has been selected to go on an Honor Flight to Washington, DC, in just a few days, as a veteran of the Vietnam War. He will be accompanied by Charles Wallis, who will travel with Don on the Honor Flight as his guardian. It's quite an honor to be selected as a participant in this program.

The Honor Flight Network is designed to celebrate America's veterans by inviting them to share in a day of honor at our nation's memorials. The trip is free for the honored veteran and the guardian pays for his or her trip. The veteran or family member submits an application. Top priority is given to WWII Veterans followed by Korean War Veterans, then Vietnam Veterans,

or a veteran who is currently terminally ill, and continues in chronological order of conflicts. Anyone serving anywhere at any time during the following dates is a veteran of the war or conflict:

- WWII December 7, 1941 December 31, 1946
- Cold War: Dec 1946 Dec 26, 1991
- Korean War: June 25, 1950 January 31, 1955
- Vietnam War: February 28, 1961 May 7, 1975
- Lebanon/Grenada: August 24, 1982 July 31, 1984
- Panama: December 20, 1989 January 31, 1990
- Gulf War/War on Terrorism: August 2, 1990 Present





These three-day trips include stops at military and war memorials, Arlington National Cemetery, and other sites. The trips are powerful, emotional celebrations of military service and friendship, a time of healing and closure, and an opportunity for veterans to receive long-overdue thanks for their service and sacrifice.

Don was stationed in Udorn, Thailand during the Vietnam War where he worked on the flight line and in the revetments removing and replacing photographic equipment from F-4 fighter jets. Wallis, himself an army veteran, is currently the instructor of the California Cadet Corp at Rosamond High School. Sladek and his guardian, Wallis, will be traveling to Washington, D.C. April 8 - April 10. And they will return just in time to share about this inspiring adventure at the meeting on April 15th.

The Vietnam War - a Brief Overview

The Vietnam War, 1 November 1955 – 30 April 1975, was an armed conflict in Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia fought between North Vietnam (Democratic Republic of Vietnam) and South Vietnam (Republic of Vietnam) and their allies. North Vietnam was supported by the Soviet Union and China, while South Vietnam was supported by the United States and other anti-communist nations. The conflict was the second of the Indochina Wars and a major proxy war of the Cold War between the Soviet Union and US. Direct US military involvement greatly escalated from 1965 until its withdrawal in 1973. The fighting spilled over into the Laotian and Cambodian Civil Wars, which ended with all three countries becoming communist in 1975.

The **Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017** was signed into law by U.S. President Donald J. Trump, **designating every March 29 as National Vietnam War Veterans Day**. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Vietnam_War


